

## SCHOOL PLAN OVERVIEW 2021-22

#### Learning Models - Defined

- On-Site Learning
  - Delivery of student learning will be done face-to-face in building with appropriate mitigation steps in place. School will be based on the regular school schedule.
- Individualized Remote Learning
  - Springville CSD will not be offering an individualized remote learning option for the 2021-22 school year. All open enrollment requests for the 2021-22 school year to attend an accredited virtual school in Iowa will be approved.
- Required Remote Learning (District/State Mandated)
  - ► The Governor signed legislation per SF160 making this illegal for Iowa schools. The only way we would do Required Online Learning is if there was a change or mandate in the law for schools.

#### On-Site Learning

- Students will be educated in an on-site learning environment.
- Regular, full-days of school following the district-approved calendar with safety and health mitigation processes and procedures will be in place.
- Families that are uncomfortable with returning to on-site learning, due to COVID-related reasons, can apply for open enrollment to an accredited virtual school.



#### Technology

- Every student in grades K-12 will be assigned a device to facilitate on-site learning:
  - K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade students will be assigned an iPad
  - ► 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be assigned a Chromebook
  - 7<sup>th</sup>-12th grade students will be assigned a Macbook
- Students in grades 3-12 will be allowed to take their device home with a signed acceptable use policy.
- Students in grades K-2 will be allowed to take their device home if self-isolating or if all students are moved to a remote learning model and a signed acceptable use policy.



#### Face Coverings

- Employees and students in grades PK-12 will have a personal choice as to whether they will wear face coverings inside the school building.
- All students and staff will respect others' personal choice on face coverings.
- Face coverings will be required of all students and staff when riding in school transportation due to federal mandates.
- The district will provide face coverings upon request.



#### General Health/Safety

#### **Prevention Practices**

- Springville CSD will follow the guidelines and recommendations in place from the lowa Department of Public Health in regards COVID-19.
- If you experience any COVID symptoms, please call your family health care provider for further guidance.

# Cover Coughs and Sneezes

Stop the spread of germs that can make you and others sick!



Cover your mouth and nose with a **tissue** when you sneeze or cough.



If you don't have a tissue, use your **elbow**.



Wash hands often, **especially** after coughing or sneezing.

#### Transportation

- ► Face coverings will be required by staff and students PK-12 in all school vehicles. This includes all school activities.
- Hand sanitizer will be available on all buses.
- Social distancing will be practiced when possible.
- Bus surfaces will be disinfected more frequently than normal.
- Windows may be open to increase circulation of fresh air on the bus while in operation, when possible.
- If concerned with transportation, we would encourage parents to drop off/pick up your child at school or activities.

#### Arrival/Drop-Off

- Parents will be encouraged to not exit the vehicles during pick-up/drop off at school.
- If there is a need to enter the building, please check in at your respective offices.
- Drop off time should not be before 7:45 a.m. each day if eating breakfast at the school or 8:00 am each day for regular drop-off.
- Parents bringing/dropping off students to school should drop/pick up at either the elementary or secondary doors, based on where your students typically exit.

#### Food Service


- Lunch will return to normal as much as possible.
- Regular school lunch trays will be used by food service staff for serving meals this year. We will still use plastic silverware per the state's guidance.
- All students will be eating in the lunchroom.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be placed outside of each entrance.
- We will not be doing a salad or fruit bar to start the school year. This may come back during the school year.
- Outside guests will not be permitted for lunch.

#### Volunteers/Parents/Visitors

- Staff and student/parent meetings will be held in-person, (IEP, 504, parent/teacher conferences) Virtual meetings may be an option if requested.
- Volunteers/Visitors will be limited during the school day and must be approved into the buildings by administration for educational purposes only.


### Assemblies/Large Gatherings/Field Trips

- All field trips and school-related assemblies have been reinstated.
- Field trips will require all participants to wear a mask while being transported in school vehicles.



#### School Activities and Public Events

- Outside community groups will be permitted to use school buildings again this year with school permission.
- School activities and athletics will follow district procedures and refer to athletic association/union and public health guidance for any further guidance.
- Face masks will be required when riding in school vehicles per federal mandate.
