Springville Illness Protocol Updated 01/13/2022

**This is a fluid document and will be updated as new information is available.

- Your child will be sent home from school or should be kept home from school if they have a fever over 100.4 degrees, is coughing uncontrollably, has vomited, or is having diarrhea. If a student or staff member is sent home or stays home due to illness, they will be advised to seek an evaluation by a health care provider and we will follow any written doctor orders.
- If a student or staff member is sent home due to illness, they may return to school when the following criteria have been met:
 - 1. No fever for at least 24 hours without the use of medicine that reduces fevers
 - 2. No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours

AND

- 3. Symptoms have improved
- If a student is treated with antibiotics for any illness (such as strep throat, pink eye, pneumonia), they may return to school when the following criteria have been met:
 - 1. 24 hours after start of treatment

AND

- No fever for at least 24 hours without the use of medicine that reduces fevers
- If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, they will isolate until the following criteria have been met:
 - 1. No fever for at least 24 hours without the use of medicine that reduces fevers AND
 - 2. Symptoms have improved

AND

- 3. At least 5 full days have passed since symptoms first appeared AND
- 4. Continue to wear a well-fitting mask for 5 additional days. If they are unable to wear a mask around others, they should continue to isolate themselves for a full 10 days.
- If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19 and does not have symptoms (asymptomatic), they will isolate until the following criteria have been met:
 - 1. At least 5 days have passed from their first positive test AND
 - 2. They continue to have no symptoms since the test AND

- 3. Continue to wear a well-fitting mask for 5 additional days. If they are unable to wear a mask around others, they should continue to isolate themselves for a full 10 days. *If the person develops symptoms during the time they are isolating, the 10 day period starts again.
- If a student or staff member has had close contact (within 6ft for more than 15 minutes) with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19, it is advised:
 - o For 10 days after your last close contact with someone with COVID-19, watch for fever (100.4∘F or greater), cough, shortness of breath, or other COVID-19 symptoms .
 - If you develop symptoms, get tested immediately and isolate until you receive your test results. If you test positive, follow isolation recommendations.
 - Wear a well-fitting mask when around others until 10 days after your last close contact with someone with COVID-19.
- If a student or staff member is awaiting COVID test results, the student or staff member is advised to quarantine until test results are received, regardless of symptoms.
